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General instructions

Notes on the Documentation

This description is only intended for the use of trained specialists in control and automation engineering who are familiar with the applicable national standards. It is essential that the following notes and explanations are followed when installing and commissioning these components. The responsible staff must ensure that the application or use of the products described satisfy all the requirements for safety, including all the relevant laws, regulations, guidelines and standards.

Basic safety measures

Only switch the PC off after closing the software

Before the Industrial PC is switched off, software that is running must be properly closed.

Otherwise it is possible that data on the hard disk is lost. Please read the section on *Switching the Industrial PC on and off.*



Switch off all parts of the equipment, then uncouple the fieldbus! Before opening the housing of the PC, and whenever the PC is being used for purposes other than plant control, such as during functional tests following repair, all parts of the equipment must first be switched off, after which the Industrial PC can be uncoupled from the plant.

Pulling out the fieldbus connection plug uncouples the PC (optional).

Items of equipment that have been switched off must be secured against being switched on again.

The Industrial PC's power supply unit must be supplied with 100-240 V_{AC} or 24 V_{DC} (optional).



Do not open the power supply unit while voltage is applied!

The supply voltage must be switched off before the power supply unit housing is opened.

Do not exchange any parts when under power!

When components are being fitted or removed, the supply voltage must be switched off.

Fitting work on the Industrial PC can result in damage:

- If metal objects such as screws or tools fall onto operating circuit boards.
- If connecting cables internal to the PC are removed or inserted during operation.
- If plug-in cards are removed or inserted when the PC is switched on.

Operator's obligation to exercise diligence

The operator must ensure that

- the Industrial PC is only used for its intended use (see also *Product Description*).
- the Industrial PC is in a sound condition and in working order during operation.
- the operation manual is in good condition and complete, and always available for reference at the location of the Industrial PC.
- the Industrial PC is operated, maintained and repaired only by sufficiently qualified and authorised personnel.
- the personnel is instructed regularly about relevant occupational safety and environmental protection aspects, and is familiar with the operating manual and in particular the safety notes contained herein
- none of the safety and warning notes attached to the Industrial PC are removed, and that all notes remain legible.

National regulations depending on the machine type

Depending on the type of machine and plant in which the Industrial PC is being used, there will be national regulations for the control of such machines and plant that the operator must observe. These regulations cover, amongst other things, the intervals between inspections of the controller.

The operator must initiate such inspections in good time.



Only trained persons may open the Industrial PC housing!

The operator is responsible for ensuring that only trained electrical staff opens the housing of the Industrial PC.

Procedure in the event of a fault

In the event of a fault in the Industrial PC, appropriate measures can be determined with the aid of the list in the *Fault correction* section.

Operator requirements

Read the operating instructions

Every user of the Industrial PC must have read these operating instructions.

Software knowledge

Every user must be familiar with any of the functions of the software installed on the PC that he can reach.

Product Description

Appropriate Use

The C61xx series Industrial PCs are designed for mounting in control cabinets for machine and plant engineering applications.

Structure

Example: front view of Industrial PC C6140



Opening the housing

The C61xx series Industrial PCs can be opened by removing the cover (see top photograph).

Moving the handle at the lower edge (1) releases the cover.

Example: internal view of Industrial PC C6140



Removing the cover provides access to the floppy drive (1), the 3½ inch hard disk (2), the CD-ROM drive (3), the power supply (4) and the motherboard (5) with processor, memory and plug-in cards. A standard ATX motherboard is used.

Interfaces from C6140-0060/ C6150-0060

ATX motherboard interfaces



PS/2 connections

PS/2

The upper PS/2 connector (**X104**) allows a PS/2 mouse to be used, while a PC keyboard can be connected to the lower PS/2 connector (**X103**).

Serial interfaces

RS 232 COM1 - COM2 The basic version of the Industrial PC has two serial interfaces, COM1 (**X105**) and COM2, using the type RS 232, which are each brought to a 9 pin SUB-D plug connector. The interface COM2 is located in the upper part of the first slot right beside the ATX-slot.

USB interfaces

USB1 - USB4

The four USB interfaces (**X108** – **X111**) are used to connect peripheral devices with USB connections:

- Devices with Intel[®] 4th generation processors (C6140-0060/ C6150-0060) are equipped with 2 USB2.0 (X110, X111) and 2 USB3.0 (X108, X109) interfaces
- Devices with Intel[®] 6th and 7th generation processors (C6140-0070/C6150-0070) are equipped with 4 USB3.0 interfaces.

Network connection

LAN1 LAN2 The RJ-45 connector (**X112**) allows the PC to be connected to a 10/100/1000BASE-T Local Area Network (LAN). The RJ-45 connector (**X113**) allows the PC to be connected to a 10/100/1000BASE-T Local Area Network (LAN).

Sound-On-Board

Sound

The Industrial PC has a on-board-interface with the following connectors: Line In (X116), Line Out (X115) and Microphone jack (X114).

DVI-D (Digital Visual Interface)

DVI-D out

The DVI connectors (**X117**, **X118**) are used for transferring the video signal. DVI-D standard is supported.

DisplayPort

DisplayPort

The DisplayPort (X119) is used for transferring the video signal.

Additional Interfaces (optional)

Connection of a control panel (optional)

CP-Link Interface card If a CP-Link interface card is fitted, a control panel can be connected to the Industrial PC.



The two coaxial connectors are connected here with the control panel, and the 26-pin sub-D socket connector is connected to the lower PS/2 connection and to the serial COM1 interface. Use of the control panel in parallel with an external keyboard is supported by the interface card.

External keyboard

An external keyboard can be connected via the PS/2 socket.



Additional plug-in cards (optional)

Type plate

A type plate is located behind an inspection window in the front cover, providing information about the Industrial PC equipment as delivered.

Transport and Unpacking

The specified storage conditions must be observed (see chapter *Technical data*).

Transport

Despite the robust design of the unit, the components are sensitive to strong vibrations and impacts. During transport, your Industrial PC should therefore be protected from excessive mechanical stress. Therefore, please use the original packaging.



If the device is transported in cold weather or is exposed to extreme variations in temperature, make sure that moisture (condensation) does not form on or inside the device.

Prior to operation, the unit must be allowed to slowly adjust to room temperature. Should condensation occur, a delay time of approximately 12 hours must be allowed before the unit is switched on.

Unpacking

Proceed as follows to unpack the unit:

- 1. Remove packaging.
- 2. Do not discard the original packaging. Keep it for future relocation.
- 3. Check the delivery for completeness by comparing it with your order.
- 4. Please keep the associated paperwork. It contains important information for handling the unit.
- 5. Check the contents for visible shipping damage.
- 6. If you notice any shipping damage or inconsistencies between the contents and your order, you should notify Beckhoff Service.



Installation of the PC in the control cabinet

The C61xx Industrial PCs are designed for mounting in control cabinets for machine and plant engineering applications.

The ambient conditions specified for operation must be observed (see chapter *Technical data*).

Preparation of the control cabinet

Four holes for the fixing bolts have to be provided in the control cabinet according to the dimensions of the PC (see chapter *Assembly dimensions*).



When the unit is installed in an enclosure, adequate space for ventilation and for opening the PC must be provided.

The clearance above and below the housing must be at least 50 mm in order to ensure adequate ventilation of the PC.



Extreme environmental conditions should be avoided as far as possible. Protect the PC from dust, moisture and heat.

The ventilation slots of the PC must not be covered.

Earthing measures

Earthing measures




Earthing connections dissipate interference from external power supply cables, signal cables or cables to peripheral equipment.

Establish a low-impedance connection from the earthing point on the PC housing to the central earthing point on the control cabinet wall, in which the computer is being installed. The earthing connection is located at the top of the housing (see photograph on the left).

Power Supply Connection

The 5-pin CAGE CLAMP plug connector and mounting flange illustrated is located on the PC housing in order to connect the power supply.

Supplied mains power unit

The Industrial PCs is either fitted with a 100-240 V, 50-60 Hz power supply unit (standard) or with a 24 V_{DC} power supply unit (with the option of an uninterruptible power supply, UPS).


Fitting the Power Supply Cable

Coding pieces



Differently coded plug connectors

The connectors are coded differently at the factory, using snap-on coding pieces, according to the power supply unit that has been fitted.



Coding for the 100-240 V_{AC} , 50-60 Hz power supply unit



Coding for the 24 V_{DC} power supply unit

A 5-pin female plug connector with CAGE CLAMP connection and insertion catches is supplied along with a snap-on strain relief housing in order to assemble the PC power supply cable.

Materials for assembly of the connector

Strain relief housing

Female plug connector is correspondingly coded

This female plug connector is also coded at the factory, according to the type of power supply fitted, so that the plug, when assembled, will fit the Industrial PC's connecting socket.


Pin assignment

Pin assignment and cable requirements

There is an adhesive label with the pin assignments on the top of the female plug connector. The minimum permitted conductive cross-section is 1.5 mm², fused for 10 A (AWG 16).

Fitting the connector to the cable

The plug is fitted to the cable as follows:

- 1. Strip insulation from the cable ends. Follow the technical data for the female plug connector in the above table!
- 2. Push the conductors into their mountings, simply by pushing them in as indicated on the pin assignment label.
- 3. Push the lower part (part **A**) of the strain relief housing onto the top of the female plug connector until it snaps into place.
- 4. Relieve the strain on the supply cable by fixing it in place with the cable clamp (part **C**) and fixing screws (part **D**).

Applying the strain relief



Fix the upper part (part ${\bf B}$) of the strain relief housing by snapping it onto the lower part.

Warning

Connecting devices

The power supply plug must be withdrawn!

Please read the documentation for the external devices prior to connecting them.

During thunderstorms, plug connector must neither be inserted nor removed.

When disconnecting a plug connector, always handle it at the plug. Do not pull the cable!

Connecting cables

The connections are located at the top of the Industrial PC and are documented in the product description chapter.

When connecting the cables to the Industrial PC, proceed according to the following sequence:

- Switch off all the devices that are to be connected.
- Disconnect all the devices that are to be connected from the power supply.
- Connect all the cables between the Industrial PC and to the devices that are to be connected.
- Connect all data transfer cables (if present) to the appropriate plug-in receptacles of the data/telecommunication networks.
- Reconnect all devices to the power supply.

Check voltage rating and connect.

With compact 100-240 V_{AC} 50/60 Hz power supply:

- 1. Check that the mains voltage is correct.
- Insert the power supply cable that you have assembled (see the section on *Fitting the Power* Supply Cable) into the Industrial PC's power supply socket. Then connect it to a power socket with a grounded earth connection.

When fitted with the (optional) 24 V_{DC} power supply unit:

- 1. Check that the external power supply is providing the correct voltage.
- Insert the power supply cable that you have assembled (see the section on *Fitting the Power* Supply Cable) into the Industrial PC's power supply socket. Then connect it to your external 24 V power supply.



If a 24 V UPS is installed, the correct type of rechargeable battery must be used.

Switching the Industrial PC on and off

Switch on

The Industrial PC does not have its own mains switch. The Industrial PC will start when the equipment is switched on, or when it is connected to the power supply.

Shutting down and switching off

When the plant is switched off, or when it is disconnected from its power supply, the Industrial PC will be switched off.

Control software such as is typically used on Industrial PCs permits various users to be given different rights. A user who may not close software may also not switch the Industrial PC off, since data can be lost from the hard disk by switching off while software is running.



First shut down, then switch off the PC!

If the Industrial PC is switched off as the software is writing a file to the hard disk, the file will be destroyed. Control software typically writes something to the hard disk every few seconds, so that the probability of causing damage by switching off while the software is running is very high.



When you have shut down the Industrial PC, you have to switch off power supply for at least 10 seconds before rebooting the system.

After resetting power supply the PC will start booting automatically.

Reset key

A Reset button for rebooting the system is provided on the front cover.



LEDs

Three LEDs are located next to the Reset button.

The red LED signalises hard disk activity, the green LED signalises the presence of the voltage supply, while the yellow LED indicates Turbo operation.

First switching on and driver installation

When you switch on the Industrial PC for the first time, the pre-installed operating system (optional) will be started. In this case, all the required drivers for any additional, optional hardware components ordered with the PC will already have been installed.

If the PC was ordered without operating system, you have to install the operating system and the driver software for any auxiliary hardware yourself. Please follow the instructions in the documentation for the operating system and the additional devices.

Cleaning the Industrial PC



Switch off the Industrial PC and all connected devices, and disconnect the Industrial PC from the power supply.

The Industrial PC can be cleaned with a soft, damp cloth. Do not use any aggressive cleaning materials, thinners, scouring material or hard objects that could cause scratches.

Replacing the battery on the motherboard

A used battery on the motherboard has to be replaced.

Danger of Explosion!

Replace battery only with the identical type or an alternative type recommended by the manufacturer. Notice correct polarity!

Handling of Lithium Batteries

Lithium Batteries should not be recharged, exposed to fire, opened and they should be protected against sunlight and moisture.

The used battery must be disposed of in accordance with national electronics scrap regulations.

Servicing

The Industrial PC requires no maintenance.

Shutting down

Disposal

Dismantling the Industrial PC

The device must be fully dismantled in order to dispose of it. The housing can be sent for metal recycling.

Observe national electronics scrap regulations

Electronic parts such as disk drives and circuit boards must be disposed of in accordance with national electronics scrap regulations.

Fault correction



Industrial PC C6140


The assembly of the unit must take place with the orientation diagrammed here.
